Membership Fees

Each member of the Australian Kenseikan KarateDo (AKK) Club must complete the 2012 AKK Club Membership Form.

Payment of membership fees entitles you to become a full member of AKK Karate Club for 1 year. The Club uses these fees to cover the costs including; insurance, affiliation with Japan AKK Headquarters, affiliation with Queensland Karate Association (QKA), affiliation with Australian Karate Federation (AKF), Dojo lease fees, equipment and any required administration.

Annual Membership Fees

Per Student : \$100 per year (pro rata after 6 months)

Training Fees (Karate)

Training fees cover attendance at training and are paid quarterly, in line with the official Queensland school term calendar. Please note that fees are payable at the commencement of each term.

Fees Per Student :

- Option A : \$10 per class (payable prior to training)
- Option B : \$150 per term (2 classes per week)
- Option C : \$200 per term (unlimited classes per week)

Additional Private Lesson fee: \$45 per hour (upon request).

Note: For grading purposes, students must attend 2 classes per week. One class must be Kata and either a Basic or Kumite class the other.

Junior Grading Fees

\$30.00—7th kyu to 1st kyu

\$50.00—sho dan and \$50.00 per dan thereafter

Grading fees must be paid in full 1 weeks prior to grading.

Senior Grading Fees

\$40.00—7th kyu to 1st kyu

\$100.00—sho dan and \$100.00 per dan thereafter

Grading fees must be paid in full 1 weeks prior to grading.

Late Fees

Term Fees are due within 2 weeks of commencement of a term. A late fee will apply if training fees are not paid in full by the end of the 5th week of the training term.

Kenseikan KarateDo

Kenseikan Karate Do is a member of the Japan Karate Federation and the Australian Karate Federation and follows a traditional Shotokan style whose founder was Gichin Funakoshi.

The meaning of Kenseikan in its pure form is – “Ken” is a fist, and “Sei” is life. Adding a Zen influence it translates as –

“Live your life believing in the power of your own true self”.

This understanding sums up Kenseikans' Head Instructor Kazutoshi Oda and Australias' Chief Instructot Jon Rawlings. Both Kazutoshi Sensei and JR have been training in Karate Do for over 35 years and were taught and guided by Nakanishi Sensei, Kiyohara Sensei, Sakai Sensei, Takemori Sensei and John Halpin.

Kazutoshi Sensei and JR were shown a new and different path from their original Dojo, and have forged a close friendship based on two deep and creative people, Tainen Takemori Kancho, the founder of Seikukan Japan, and John Halpin, the founder of Seikukan Australia.

Kenseikan Dojo

Kenseikan Karate Dojo's are affiliated with the State Body (QKA), who are affiliated with the National Body (AKF). The AKF is the official Karate Federation of the Australian government. The AKF is a member of the Oceania Karate Federation, which in turn is a member of the World Karate Federation.

Jon Rawlings, the Kenseikan KarateDo Chief Instructor, is an executive member of the QKA and a member of the AKF referee council. Jon is also an Oceania Kata judge, and a world Kumite judge. This allows students of the AKK Club to learn traditional martial arts and provides the opportunity to represent their club, State or Country at official Karate competitions.
